The Additional Information Booklet also contains the definition of capitalised terms used in this PDS.

1. About CIML

Channel Investment Management Limited ACN 163 234 240 AFSL 439007 ('CIML', 'RE', 'we', 'our' or 'us') is a trustee/responsible entity and manager of a number of managed investment schemes and is the issuer of this PDS. Channel Capital Pty Ltd ACN 162 591 568 (authorised representative number 1274413) ('Channel Capital') provides investment management infrastructure and services across several asset classes and is the holding company of CIML.

CIML is licensed under the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) ('Corporations Act') to act as responsible entity of the Fund. We are responsible for managing the Fund in accordance with the Corporations Act and the constitution of the Fund. You can obtain a copy of the constitution by contacting us and requesting a copy be made available to you.

CIML and its holding company, Channel Capital, have forged strategic partnerships with international and Australian fund

managers across a range of different asset classes including Australian and global securities, alternative investments and fixed income securities.

The CBRE Global Infrastructure Securities Fund (the 'Fund') provides exposure to a range of geographic regions and infrastructure sectors that may include utilities, transportation, energy infrastructure and communication infrastructure.

CBRE Investment Management Listed Real Assets LLC
CIML has appointed CBRE Investment Management Listed
Real Assets LLC (the 'Investment Manager') as the investment
manager of the Fund. The Investment Manager is the listed
investment management entity of CBRE Investment Management
('CBRE'), a leading global real assets investment management
firm. The Investment Manager specialises in global real estate and
infrastructure investing across securities and unlisted investments.

2. How the CBRE Global Infrastrucuture Securities Fund works

The Fund is an Australian registered managed investment scheme in which amounts invested by individual investors are pooled to buy assets on behalf of all investors in the Fund.

When you invest in the Fund you are issued with Units. Your Units represent a beneficial interest in the Fund's assets as a whole. Your investment is not a direct investment in specific Fund assets. The value of your investment changes whenever Unit prices are recalculated. The price of Units will vary as the market value of the Fund's assets rise or fall. The most recent Unit prices are available at www.channelcapital.com.au. Generally, you can increase your

investment in the Fund by applying to acquire additional Units. You can also decrease your investment in the Fund by withdrawing some or all of your Units.

This PDS applies to Class A Units. References to 'Units' in this PDS refer to Class A Units, unless context states otherwise. We may in the future offer different classes of units in the Fund via a separate PDS or information memorandum which may have different rights and restrictions. We treat all investors within a class of units equally and investors in different classes fairly.

Withdrawals	You can apply to withdraw all or part of your investment at any time, subject to the Fund being liquid. If you are investing through an IDPS, your IDPS operator will provide you with information about withdrawals and any additional requirements.
	Written withdrawal requests should be lodged by email or mail with the RE prior to 12pm (Sydney time) on any Business Day. The withdrawal amount payable is calculated using the withdrawal price as at close of business on that day. If a withdrawal request is received after 12pm (Sydney time) or on a non-Business Day, it is deemed to be received the following Business Day, and the withdrawal amount payable is calculated using the Unit price for that Business Day.

Withdrawals

The RE endeavours to ensure that all withdrawal proceeds are paid within 6 Business Days from the date of receipt of the withdrawal request. Investors should note however, that the Fund's constitution allows up to 21 days from acceptance of a withdrawal request. In some circumstances, such as when there is a freeze on withdrawals, during restricted or suspended trading or when there is extreme price fluctuation or uncertainty in the market for the assets of the Fund, investors may not be able to withdraw their investment within the usual period upon request. In addition, if at a valuation time, we estimate to have received total withdrawal requests exceeding

In addition, if at a valuation time, we estimate to have received total withdrawal requests exceeding 5% of the total number of Units on issue, we may defer a proportion of each request on a pro rata basis so that each redeeming investor receives redemption proceeds based on prices determined at successive valuation times.

Benefits of investing in the CBRE Global Infrastructure Securities Fund

A summary of the significant features and benefits of investing in the Fund is as follows:

The Fund is managed by the Investment Manager, a specialist in real assets securities including global real estate and infrastructure. The Investment Manager has an experienced and well-resourced team specialised in managing global real estate stock portfolios. The Investment Manager's global research team is located in offices in the United States, the United Kingdom, Hong Kong, Japan and Australia and provides a comprehensive world view through their in-depth analysis of local listed and direct real estate market trends and regulatory conditions.
The Fund provides diversified exposure to infrastructure companies across geographies, industry sectors, and sub-sectors which may include (but are not limited to) transportation, utilities, energy and communications assets.
The Fund provides Investors with an actively managed exposure to global listed infrastructure securities, invested across a range of geographic regions and infrastructure sectors. The infrastructure market is growing due to the ongoing need to invest in aging infrastructure in the developed markets, changing energy needs (driving investment in gas and renewable infrastructure), and the need for new infrastructure to support the growth of emerging markets
The Fund aims to provide a total return consisting of capital growth and income, by investing in infrastructure securities that may provide predictable and stable cash flows.

These benefits and features of the Fund are however subject to the various risks which may apply to an investment in the Fund as described below.

4. Risks of managed investment schemes

Investors need to understand the investment risks involved before investing in the Fund.

All investments carry risk. Different strategies may carry different levels of risk, depending on the assets that make up that strategy. Assets with the highest long-term returns may also carry the highest level of short-term risk. The value of investments and the level of returns will vary. Future returns may differ from past returns and past performance is not a reliable guide to future performance. Neither CIML, the Investment Manager, CBRE, their directors,

associates nor any of their related bodies guarantee the success of the Fund, the repayment of capital or any particular rate of capital or income return. Investments in the Fund are not guaranteed or underwritten by CIML, the Investment Manager, CBRE, or any other person or party and you may lose some or all of your investment. Some of the key risks that may impact the value of your investment in the Fund are outlined below. You need to consider the level of risk that you are comfortable with, taking into account factors such as your age, your investment time frame, other assets and investments that you have, and your overall tolerance for risk.

General investment risk

Investment in shares, in general, carries a higher level of risk than investments in many other asset classes such as cash or fixed interest. There are certain market conditions in which any given investment strategy is unlikely to be profitable. Neither CIML, the Investment Manager or CBRE have the ability to control or predict such market conditions.

Market risk

Movements in financial markets due to economic, environmental or political conditions, or from general market sentiment, will result in the value of the Fund's underlying assets, and hence the value of your investment, moving up or down.

Investment Manager and responsible entity risk

The Fund is an actively managed portfolio and the Investment Manager's investment style may have significant impacts on the investment returns of the Fund. No single investment style will perform better than all other investment styles in all market conditions. There is a risk that the investment techniques and risk analysis employed by the Investment Manager in making investment decisions for the Fund will not produce the desired results. There is a risk that the Investment Manager's investment strategy may not be successful, and result in the underperformance of the Fund, either relative to the market and/or its peers or in absolute terms.

Additionally, there is a risk that the Investment Manager may fail to successfully implement the investment strategy successfully which may result in the loss of a significant proportion of your investment in the Fund. Matters such as the loss of key staff, the replacement of CIML as responsible entity of the Fund, or the Investment Manager of the Fund, or the failure of either CIML or the Investment Manager to perform as expected may negatively impact returns, risks and/or liquidity.

Infrastructure risk

Infrastructure-related businesses are subject to a variety of factors that may adversely affect their business or operations. These include but are not limited to changing costs, high leverage and interest costs, the impact of economic slowdowns, regulation, adverse changes in fuel prices and the effects of energy conservation

policies. Infrastructure investments are also exposed to other risks associated with large-scale capital construction programs.

Derivative risk

The Fund may use derivative instruments, which seek to modify or replicate the investment performance of particular securities, currencies, interest rates, indices or markets on a leveraged or unleveraged basis, and to more efficiently manage the Funds' portfolio and its risks. For example, the use of derivatives may be a more costeffective way of gaining exposure to a particular asset or sector as compared to holding a physical asset. The value of derivatives can be influenced by a number of factors and risks associated with their use, including movements in the value of the underlying asset, leverage offered by trading in derivative instruments, difficulty in liquidating the derivative, and counterparty risk. The use of derivative positions to hedge the risk of physical securities may involve "basis risk", which refers to the possibility that the derivative positions may not move perfectly in line with the physical security. As a consequence, the derivative position cannot always be expected to perfectly hedge the risk of the physical security.

Regulatory & tax risk

The value of some investments may be adversely affected by changes in government policies, regulations and laws, including tax laws and laws affecting managed investment schemes, or interpretation or administration of those laws could have adverse implications on the investment or on you as a unitholder.

5. How we invest your money

Before deciding whether to apply for Units, you should consider the likely investment return, the risks involved in investing in the Fund and your investment timeframe.

Fund description	The Fund is an actively managed fund that invests in global listed infrastructure securities. The Investment Manager is an active asset manager that uses fundamental analysis to build a portfolio of global listed infrastructure securities. The Fund will primarily invest in companies that derive stable income from owning or operating long-duration infrastructure assets. Infrastructure assets are typically employed to provide essential services to society, making the companies that own or operate them less sensitive to the economic cycle. Thus, infrastructure companies are typically a source of more stable and predictable cash flows and dividends. The Investment Manager's investment discipline is a fundamental multi-step investment process that combines top-down sector and regional allocation with bottom-up stock selection, leading to active positions at the sector, regional and individual stock level. The Investment Manager defines the infrastructure investment universe broadly in order to provide a comprehensive set of potential investments through which it aims to deliver attractive risk-adjusted returns in various market cycles and regulatory conditions.	
Objective	The Fund aims to outperform the FTSE Global Core Infrastructure 50/50 Index (Net) AUD Hedged (the 'Benchmark') (after management fees and costs) over rolling three-year periods. ¹	
Strategy	The Fund predominantly invests in listed infrastructure securities issued by global infrastructure companies, which are primarily entities located throughout the world that derive at least 50% of their revenues or profits from, or devote at least 50% of their assets to, the ownership, management, development or operation of infrastructure assets. The Fund will primarily invest in ordinary shares of listed infrastructure companies, unit trusts, cash, derivatives and currency instruments. It may also invest in or acquire other equity-like securities such as preferred shares, convertible securities, depositary receipts and rights or warrants to buy ordinary shares.

Minimum suggested timeframe

At least seven (7) years.

Switching

Currently, the Fund does not offer a choice of investment options thus the ability to switch between different products is not available

Labour standards, environmental social and ethical considerations

The Fund is not designed for investors who have specific labour standards or environmental, social or ethical (*ESG*) goals. The integration of ESG considerations into the Investment Manager's investment process described below does not imply the Fund is marketed or authorised as an ESG product in Australia. When selecting, retaining or realising investments of the Fund, and subject to publicly available information, the Investment Manager considers economic and valuation factors including labour standards and ESG considerations. The Investment Manager considers labour standards and ESG factors in the investment process, but the extent of the consideration and the factors may vary over time.

The Investment Manager has developed a proprietary sustainability scorecard to assess a company's sustainability risks and performance. The sustainability scorecard covers matters such as:

- environmental issues including energy targets and conservation efforts where applicable, environmental regulations, and climate risk mitigation;
- social issues including employee satisfaction, health and safety and stakeholder engagement; and
- · governance issues including board structure, shareholder alignment, anti-takeover defences and executive compensation.

The above examples are provided for illustrative purposes and are not a complete list of all ESG considerations taken into account. The Investment Manager assesses company sustainability activities, including completion of the sustainability scorecard, through information obtained from publicly disclosed documents, third-party data providers and via engagement with companies.

The proprietary sustainability score is one of several factors the Investment Manager considers when evaluating the investment potential of a company and it is not solely determinative on whether an investment is made by the Investment Manager.

There is a risk that the relevant information is not publicly available, the internal and external research processes adopted may not operate as fully intended and that companies in the portfolio may not necessary meet all of the ESG requirements at all times.

The Investment Manager conducts portfolio oversight regularly and the sustainability scorecard can be used for these reviews. However, as the sustainability scorecard is only one of many investment considerations taken into account by the Investment Manager, a change in the sustainability scorecard rating will generally not trigger a rebalance event. 6. Fees and costs

Consumer and advisory warning

DID YOU KNOW?

Small differences in both investment performance and fees and costs can have a substantial impact on your long-term returns.

For example, total annual fees and costs of 2% of your investment balance rather than 1% could reduce your final return by up to 20% over a 30-year period (for example reduce it from \$100,000 to \$80,000).

You should consider whether features such as superior investment performance or the provision of better member services justify higher fees and costs.

Fees paid to a Financial Adviser

Changes to Fees

The Fund's constitution sets out the fees and expenses payable by the Fund. All fees in this PDS can change without the consent of the investors. Reasons for a change may include changing economic conditions and changes in regulation. Fees may also change due to an increase in GST payable or a change to RITCs entitled to be claimed by the Fund. You will be given written notice of any variation of fees charged by the Fund in accordance with the Corporations Act (for example, where there is an increase in management fees or an increase to or introduction of a performance fee, you will be notified 30 days before the increase or introduction takes effect). The cooling off period applies if the investment into the Fund is either new or additional and is not a reinvestment of distributions, and where you have not exercised any rights conferred by the investment during the cooling off period. You may exercise your

cooling off rights within a period of 14 days commencing on the earlier of the time your application is confirmed, or the end of the fifth Business Day after your Units are issued.

In the event you exercise your cooling off rights the amount you receive will reflect any movement (either up or down) in the Unit price of the Fund which means there may be capital gains tax implications for you. We may also be obliged to deduct any tax or duty incurred by us and reasonable administrative and transaction costs. As a result, the amount returned to you may be less than the amount initially invested.
